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Message from the Executive

From Executive Vice-presidents Maria Iosue and Olga Lipadatova

We just celebrated the arrival of spring and crossed over the yearly mark of the transition towards summer—Spring Equinox. In Canada Equinoxes are recognized by many Native cultures as they mark migration periods when traditionally many tribes moved north or south, where herds of animals and the flocks of birds migrated. The knowledge of the seasonal changes in nature was essential to the survival and sustainability of the native people. In the last year while we all collectively experienced the change in our ways of living we are also becoming more aware of the need for attunement with nature and the natural cycles.

Paradoxically, the remote mode of working that many of us are still experiencing, brought about two opposites in our life: more time to contemplate and connect to nature, and the increased use of technology. Electronic communication and practice of therapy, which appears incompatible with the practice of Sandplay, resulted in increased creativity and ability to connect and find new ways of working. CAST Board and Executive continued leading our association helping it to grow and evolve. CAST Teachers adapted together with all therapeutic community continuing training programs and finding new ways of teaching on-line and providing wonderful learning opportunities for the trainees in remote locations.

Maria and I took over executive functions as Vice-presidents a year ago. In March we reported at the board meeting about our collaborative work, which has been a very productive, positive and rather fulfilling experience.

- We carried on a number of initiatives and functions to allow CAST operating smoothly during this time
 of transition and change. We met with Dariel who is CAST President-elect several times, and we are
 very happy to report that Dariel is preparing to move into the role in the fall.
- We strengthened the board with the new members who brought with them new initiative and a great creative energy. Our Treasurer, Samira Alishanova, did a great job in reviewing CAST finances and bringing all the finance reports up to date.
- We have a new Administrator Rachel Harris, who already started working in this role succeeding our long-term Admin Assistant Ioanna Solomatina. Rachel has many qualifications and aspirations and we are very excited to welcome her to join our CAST community.
- A lot of work was done for CAST to be able to move forward, which includes the Privacy Policy and Special Events subcommittee work, Teaching Members committee (met several times), Ethics committee, and Support group. All our committees functioned well during this time.
- Maria and I met on a regular basis and discussed the plans for the management of diverse responsibilities which we hope could be delegated to others. In the plans to go forward significant areas of the organization that need strong support, as CAST is becoming a more complex organization facing on-going changes in technology and the challenges that touched the whole of the International community.
- Among other things I want to share with you a rather special event. Last year Maria was approached by the filmmaker Iven Tu who had an idea for a film which included a sandplay therapy session. They spent a long time talking after which he came to Maria's office and did a sandplay. Following that he completed a short film "Sand Land" and shared it with Maria and also the board members. Iven has created a website about the film where he expressed appreciation for CAST's "generous support" in making the film, with our logo and a link to our site. At his request CAST board approved a statement about the film to give it credibility. This film is going to be shown at the film festivals, and we are looking for a way of showing it to the members at the AGM.



I want to thank all and everyone for their ongoing support of CAST and their contribution. I also want to invite CAST members to join in with the board. We have many projects and everyone could find the best fit for their talents or bring their own ideas.

The arrival of warmer weather signals the return of spring. It represents a time of rebirth, when long days and warmth return, flowers bloom and birds sing. Every year we are reminded that spring brings renewal, and we look forward to the good tidings ahead.

ISST Policy on Personal Process

During the past year ISST Board has been working remotely meeting regularly and attending to the urgent matters of the International Sandplay community. This was not an easy time for the Representatives of the Member Societies as the time zones across the world change.

Through the second half of 2020 and during the first months of the year 2021 the ISST Board continued to monitor the impact of pandemic on the Member Societies. The Board worked on and approved the initial Statement regarding ISST Exceptions for Online Training and Supervision, allowing acceptance of all on-line training and supervision hours through the Exception Period Due To the Covid-19 Pandemic. During the most recent ISST Board Meeting of ISST held online on February 28th 2021, the Board decided to revise the "Statement" extending the exceptions period to September 30th, 2021.

Furthermore, a clarification regarding the Sandplay personal process during the pandemic was also provided after the ISST Board meeting in February. The position of ISST Certification Committee is that personal process has to be in person and cannot be substituted by the online work, no matter what shape or form that work takes.

In exceptional cases when the personal process is nearly finished the matter would have to be presented to the ISST Exceptions committee. However, the prevailing recommendation (for those whose process was interrupted by the pandemic) to complete the process when it will be possible to work in person, as the work done online is not going to be recognised as personal process.

The recommendation to CAST members in training and those undergoing Sandplay personal process is to consult your Teachers, Supervisors/Advisors and personal process therapists should you have any further questions regarding training, supervision hours or personal process. CAST/ISST Certified members providing Sandplay personal process and Teaching members will be continuously updated on any further discussions or clarifications on the issues related to ISST Certification.
